<b>CALD Connections for Young People in OOHC</b>  Facilitated by <a href="#">Noor Pathways</a>	Tues 10th Feb 10:30–12pm	Children and young people (CYP) from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds are overrepresented in the Out-of-Home Care (OOHC) system. Many experience identity loss, cultural isolation, and difficulties maintaining community connections, which can negatively impact self-esteem, mental health, and long-term outcomes. Carers play a critical role in preserving a child's cultural identity and sense of belonging, yet many report a lack of practical tools, confidence, and cultural understanding when caring for CALD children. This session will address the knowledge gap by providing specialised CALD cultural competence education for carers, focusing on affirming cultural identity, navigating system collaboration, and improving wellbeing outcomes for CALD children in care.

<b>Attachment in care and supporting the end of placement</b>  Facilitated by <a href="#">Dr Trinh Ha</a>	Tues 17th Mar 10 –12pm	Sometimes it's a hard thing to say goodbye to the kids that we have cared for. Whether you've had them in your care for just a short period of time or for longer – it's hard to know how to say goodbye in a healing way whilst respecting the attachment process to facilitate the end of a placement. This workshop will look at some of the ways we, as carers, can facilitate a positive transition and end of placement process for kids, ourselves and our families. We will pay particular attention to the different attachment styles and how this may impact the transition process.

The emotional labour of caring often asks us to give more of ourselves, sometimes leaving little space for rest, reflection, or renewal.  This two-hour workshop offers a space to pause and reconnect with your own wellbeing. Together we'll explore the impact of stress and trauma on our minds and bodies, how to activate recovery and resilience, and how to weave simple practices of self-care into everyday life.

FASD affects brain development, influencing memory, attention, learning, emotional regulation, and social skills, often alongside experiences of trauma or loss.  This webinar equips foster and kinship carers with practical, trauma-informed strategies to understand each child's needs, build on their strengths, and respond effectively to challenges. Through interactive activities and real-life scenarios, participants will gain the skills, knowledge, and confidence to provide compassionate, consistent care and help children with FASD thrive.
